LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT & ADVISORY COUNCIL (LDAC)

Each year, the Appraisal Institute gathers a group of approximately 100 individuals to participate in a series of roundtable discussions and to lobby on Capitol Hill. LDAC has served as a source of leadership and as an inspiration for new programming ideas for the Appraisal Institute for more than 30 years. Most LDAC participants are nominated and sponsored by their Appraisal Institute chapter, based on the following criteria: 1) Work experience (have minimum of three years of real estate work experience or three years of real estate instruction experience); 2) Work quality, demonstrating an outstanding ability in appraising or a related profession; and 3) Personal attributes, to be described in a letter of recommendation.
